

Director's Note

Most of the people who have heard about this production have reacted with a sweet, nostalgic smile and a sigh. Their fond memories come sometimes from Robert James Waller's 1992 novel and sometimes from the 1995 film adaptation. Those patrons need no persuasion from me. Enjoy the show.

Some people, however, have expressed reservations about the musical version of *The Bridges of Madison County*. Their objections fall mostly into two categories: the quality of the source material and the ethics of the protagonists.

To those who disparage Waller's novel, I urge you to read it again with an open mind. The book is better than its reputation. Indeed, having sold more than 60 million copies, it is one of the bestselling novels of all time—a fact which suggests that its story struck a chord deep in its many readers. The film adaptation, by all critical accounts, improved upon the novel, even garnering Meryl Streep one of her 21 Academy Award nominations. The film joins an elite club (to include *The Godfather* and *Gone With the Wind*) of screenplays that were better than their source material.

The second objection, that *Bridges* valorizes adultery, is a more complex question. Francesca and Robert *do* violate their own moral codes, not to mention that of conservative Madison County, Iowa. The most obvious defenses of their actions—that Francesca's husband and neighbors don't appreciate her, or that she chooses her family over her romance—are too glib, too cliché. Moreover, such excuses do nothing to explain the powerful appeal of Waller's story or to differentiate it from the stale melodramas to which it is so often compared. The novelist, screenwriters, and librettist went to lengths to make Francesca's husband and neighbors more sympathetic than necessary. As a result, the moral choices are no easier for the viewer than for Francesca herself.

The best response to this second objection, I believe, is to let the musical speak for itself. Almost the whole play is from the perspective of Francesca; indeed, multiple scenes take place inside her head. Without spoiling anything, I invite you to spend two hours in the world inside Francesca's frame. Only then, I hope, will you pass judgment on Francesca's conclusion: that love is always better.

Other production responsibilities have included costuming, lights, sound, and set design. Al is a retired teacher and lives in Suffolk. He took theater courses at Concord University in West Virginia and Thomas Nelson College in Hampton as well as attending the Music Theater International's Broadway Teacher's Workshop. 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
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
