

Director's Note

Though THE PROM is a return to an older style of musical theatre and giving homage to various shows and artist such as: *Wicked* and *A Chorus Line* and Bob Fosse to Kander and Ebb it also holds a mirror to parts of society. This show is based on various incidents across the US in the last decade or so however, it has a focus on a small town on the Alabama/Mississippi border that scheduled a prom for just one student and her girlfriend so she would not be able to attend the "straight" kids' prom. The courts ruled against this action in their state so much like in *Footloose* where the kids went over county lines to dance, this school chose to go over state lines to hold a "straight" prom for all students but her. This was the extreme that ignited this show's creation but there have been several instances over the decade that hold some truth to moments throughout the show.

If nothing else may THE PROM tonight help us all focus more on acceptance and understanding of others regardless of sexual orientation, how one identifies, political views and religious beliefs. Let us all step back and acknowledge that it is just "time to dance," TOGETHER.

He has worked as a Director, Dialect Coach, Designer, Actor and Educator. A graduate of Lindenwood University (M.F.A.), Univ. of Maine (M.A.), and Franklin Pierce Univ. (B.A.) Mr. Corriveau has had the pleasure of working professionally with such notables as former First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Julie Andrews, Lily Tomlin, Gregory Hines, Bruno Kirby, Ed Begley, Jr. and Bill Cosby in both television and stage performances. He has taught every aspect of theatre at colleges, universities and various theatres across the country. He has published his work WAITING FOR GODOT: A VAUDEVILLIAN APPROACH, and THE THIRD PERSON IN THE ROOM, EXISTENTIALISM IN THEATRE.
